Application of Charles Boynton No. 4886

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in ~~the~~ parole from State Prison, under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Burglary 2nd Degree

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 30th day of July, A. D. 1927, at Provo, Utah County of Utah and State of Utah, in the Fourth Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable George P. Parker presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term, and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable M. B. Pope prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Charles Boynton I was convicted under the name of same.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: C. A. Chabwick

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except what is on record
