Application of Jack Wisberry

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Burglary

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 27th day of March A. D. 1924, at Brigham City County of Boulder and State of Utah, in _____ Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Harris presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to Indeterminate and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Atty. Young prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Joseph Earl Wisberry I was convicted under the name of Jack Wisberry

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: John Meyer (brother)

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except as an accomplice on charge robbery 1915 Calif. San Diego, found not guilty of same charge in 1918. Wife and six children who need my support. Permission to state my case in person.
