Application of Jack Lewis.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Parole and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Robbery.

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 10th day of Nov A. D. 1922, at Ogden, Utah, County of Weber and State of Utah, in Third Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Kimble presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to From Five Years to Life and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-- Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Joseph S. Dunkus. I was convicted under the name of Jack Lewis.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except Burglary.
