and respectfully represent as follows:

was released from Utah State Prison Oct 1st 1917.

First—That ~~I was serving a term of imprisonment~~
where I served under
conviction and sentence on a charge of Forgery

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the ~~Sept 29~~²³ day of September 1916
A. D., at Salt Lake City, County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in Utah, 3rd. Dist. Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Hon. Chas. Morris. presiding

Third—I was sentenced to Indeterminate

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth—Honorable Hon. E. O. Leatherwood prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Tom Powers

I was convicted under the name of Tom Powers

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as
follows: No others

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except No Prior convictions

Am asking this pardon in order to secure citizenship so I may be
able to file on land Homestead.
