Application of Edwin York

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in The Utah State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of obtaining money by false pretense.

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 27th day of December A. D. 1917, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in Third District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable P. C. Evans presiding

Third—I was sentenced to Three Years. Some interpreter the law to mean an indeterminate sentence. and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth—Honorable Wilson McCarthy prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Edwin York

I was convicted under the name of Edwin York

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except This one in Utah.

Served a term of two years in Salem, Oregon, and was pardoned by Governor West. Charge--forgery.
