First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison,
under conviction and sentence on a charge of Murder 2nd. Degree.

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 25th day of October,
A. D. 1912., at Price, County of Carbon,
and State of Utah, in 7th. District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable A.H. Christensen, presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to 25 years,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the State Prison.

Fourth—Honorable J.D. Woods, prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Fred Charles Johnson.
I was convicted under the name of F.C. Johnson.

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except None.
