Application of James Donovan

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for ~~an~~ <sup>termination</sup> and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Burglary 2nd Degree

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 19th day of June A. D. 1915, at Ogden County of Weber and State of Utah, in the Second Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Howell presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to an indeterminate term for Burglary in the Second Degree and thereafter was imprisoned in the State Prison with a Recommendation to serve One Year

Fifth—My true name in full is James Joseph Donovan  
I was convicted under the name of James Donovan
