First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in The Utah State Prison
under conviction and sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 19th day of Feb
A. D. 1912, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in The 3rd judicial Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge H. C. Sooker presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to seven years

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth—Honorable E. O. Leatherwood prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is James O'Donnell

I was convicted under the name of James O'Donnell

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as
follows: one Sam Lang

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except this one
