Application of Joe Brusco

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

Termination of Sentence

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a/..... and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Burglary in the Third Degree

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 18th day of June A. D. 1915, at Ogden County of Weber and State of Utah, in Second Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable J. A. Howell presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to serve from Six Months to Three Years Recommended to One Year and thereafter was imprisoned in the State Prison

Fourth—Honorable John C. Davis prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Joseph Brusco I was convicted under the name of "....."

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Frank Brown

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except Burglary in the Third Degree.
