Application of R. W. Fowler

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a ~~favor~~ and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Third Degree Burglary

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 14th day of Dec. A. D. 1915, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in 3rd Dist. Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable C. W. Mosse presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of from one to three years and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth—Honorable E. O. Leatherwood prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Robert Walter Fowler I was convicted under the name of R. W. Fowler

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Calvin S. Cabell.

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except the one for which I am now imprisoned, and I ask for a parole or pardon for the reason that I feel I have been sufficiently punished, and I want to get out, go home to my mother and make a man of myself.
