First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 14th day of October A. D. 1910, at Ogden County of Weber and State of Utah, in The Second Judicial District court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable J. J. Howell presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to Seven years

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah Penitentiary

Fourth—Honorable N. J. Harris prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Lymon P. Seath I was convicted under the name of Will L. Seath

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except The one above mentioned.
