Application of Fred Tidland

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 14th day of Oct A. D. 1912, at St. George County of Garfield and State of Utah, in Third district Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Cronquist presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to five years and thereafter was imprisoned in the State Prison Oct. 14th 1912.

Fourth—Honorable Mr. Featherwood prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Fred Tidland I was convicted under the name of Fred Tidland.

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Erroy McCall.

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except the above.
