Application of Mr. B. Hanlon

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a ~~commutation~~^{parole} and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah state prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Third degree Burglary

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 27th day of July A. D. 1914, at Farmington County of Davis and State of Utah, in Second judicial district Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge N. J. Harris presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to serve an indefinite sentence, to be decided on by the board of pardons and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah state prison on 27th day of July 1914.

Fourth—Honorable Mr. Davis prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Robert Hanlon I was convicted under the name of Billy Hanlon

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except this one crime
