Application of Commutation of Sentence.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a commute and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and sentence on a charge of Burglary.

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 11th day of November A. D. 1907, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in The Third Judicial District court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge George Armstrong presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to serve a term of five years.

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth—Honorable Mr. Loofborough prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Forrest Francis Marion

I was convicted under the name of J. E. Daley.

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except Once.

I was sentenced to serve a term of five years from Kansas City Kansas. In 1899. I received a Pardon March 20th 93!
