Application of Louis Glyde

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison  
under conviction and sentence on a charge of Robbery.

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August  
A. D. 1914, at Brigham City, County of Boise  
and State of Utah, in Judge J. D. Call's Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge J. D. Call presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to Five years

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth—Honorable J. D. Call prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Louis Glyde  
I was convicted under the name of Louis Glyde

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as  
follows: William Smith

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except this one
