Application of J. B. Burkett

To the Honorable Board of Pardons  
of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Commutation of sentence  
and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison  
under conviction and sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the Fifteenth day of February  
A. D. 1904, at Price County of Carbon  
and State of Utah, in Seventh Judicial District court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Justice J. Jonson presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to serve two and one half  
years in State Prison  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison in  
which place I have now been confined  
eleven months.

Fourth—Honorable Wm. D. Livingston prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Ray E. Burkett  
I was convicted under the name of J. B. Burkett

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as  
follows: Harry Comstock and C. R. Knowlton

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except The sentence I  
am now serving is the only time I  
have ever been in prison
