County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Christensen presiding.

Six months to three years  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Penitentiary

Fourth—Honorable J. H. Cherry prosecuted the case.

I was convicted under the name of William King

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except one  
Third degree burglary - serving in Oklahoma
