Application of Charles Larson.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the County Jail, Manti, Utah, under conviction and sentence on a charge of petit larceny,

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 24th day of August, A. D. 1914, at Mount Pleasant, County of Sanpete, Mt. Pleasant and State of Utah, in the Precinct Justice's Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Peter Matson, Esq. presiding.

Third—I was sentenced to sixty days and \$50.00 fine, and in lieu of the payment of said fine to serve one day in jail for each dollar of the fine, and thereafter was imprisoned in the County Jail at Manti, Utah.

Fourth—Honorable Dillworth Woolley prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Charles Larson, I was convicted under the name of Charles Larson,

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any other offense except drunkenness.
