Dear Sir:

Sometime ago I presented a petition for a pardon for Frank King, and I saw by the Tribune some time later, that you would in all probability pardon him when he had been confined one year, which the paper stated would be early in October. I desire to call your attention to the fact that he has been confined since July 15, 1894, but that he was not sentenced until October 1894, but pending his trial he was held on bail, which he was unable to secure. You observe then that he has served over 13 months. With these facts before you, I take the liberty to ask you that you reconsider this matter, if not inconsistent with your views, and permit Mr. King to be released as soon as you, upon such reconsideration, may deem advisable. My reason for asking this favor of you is, that I am personally acquainted with the widowed mother of Mr. King, and know the destitute circumstances in which she is; and that if King should not be released until October, and the winter staring him in the face, it would probably be very diffi-
