Application of R. W. Clark

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination of sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of ^{3rd} ~~second~~ degree burglary

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 23rd day of August A. D. 1918, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in the third district Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable J. Lewis Brown presiding

Third—I was sentenced to an indeterminate sentence and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth—Honorable Wilson McCarthy prosecuted the case.

Fifth—My true name in full is Ralph Wolftine Clark I was convicted under the name of R. W. Clark

Sixth—The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh—I have never been convicted of any offense except burglary.
