Application of Paul Karras

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First—That I am serving a term of imprisonment ~~in~~ On Parole under conviction and sentence on a charge of Robbery

Second—I was convicted and sentenced on the 13th day of December A. D. 1915, at Tooele County of Tooele and State of Utah, in Third Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable E. C. Loofbourn presiding

Third—I was sentenced to Indeterminate

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison and was paroled on Nov. 24th, 1916, which makes me on parole for over two years.

Fourth—Honorable I. L. Baker prosecuted the case.
