Application of R. R. Lake for termination of sentence.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination of sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First -- ~~That I am serving a term of imprisonment~~
~~under conviction and a sentence on a charge of~~

Second -- I was convicted and sentenced on the 14th day of March A. D. 1921, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in the Third Judicial District Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, upon affirmation of judgment of said court by Supreme Court of Utah. See State vs. Lake 196 Pac. 1015. ~~Honorable~~ ^{presiding}

Third -- I was sentenced to the county jail of Salt Lake County, Utah for the term of six months after being adjudged guilty of the crime of involuntary manslaughter, and thereafter was imprisoned in the said jail. That on the 28th day of May 1921 I was paroled by your Honorable Board to Frank Emery, Sheriff of Salt Lake County, and have since said date been under said parole, and I now ask that my sentence be terminated and that I be given my full freedom.

Fourth -- Honorable Baldwin Robertson prosecuted the case.

Fifth -- My true name in full is R. R. Lake

I was convicted under the name of R. R. Lake

Sixth -- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh -- I have never been convicted of any offense except as above stated, and since the date of my parole I have conducted myself as a law abiding citizen.
