and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of ^{a suspended sentence of imprisonment} imprisonment in
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of third degree Burglary

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 8th day of April
A. D. 1930, at Kanab County of Kane
and State of Utah, in the Sixth Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Nephi J. Bates, Judge presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to a term of not less than six months, nor more than
four years, as I remember the sentence,
and now am held
and thereafter was imprisoned in the at Kanab, Kane County, Utah, to be dealt
with according to law, as I understand the situation.

Fourth-Honorable Olof R. Mickelsen, District Attorney prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is John Findlay Brown
I was convicted under the name of Findlay Brown,

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Claud Ford and George Young, of Kanab, Utah

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except I was never convicted of
any crime before, however, I have been cited before the Juvenile Judge
once, for Mullan Stealing. If your Honorable Board of Pardons will
pardon me for the last sentence, I will do my best to keep out of trou-
ble from now on during my lifetime.
