Application of Harry Snyder No.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination of sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the county jail of Salt Lake County under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Involuntary Manslaughter.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 10th day of December, 1929 A. D., at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake, and State of Utah, in Third District Court, Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Oscar W. McConkie presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to the County Jail of Salt Lake County for a term of one year. and thereafter was imprisoned in the said jail from the date of said sentence to the present time.

Fourth-Honorable Calvin W. Rawlings prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Harry Snyder

I was convicted under the name of Harry Snyder

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: There were no others.

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except

No exceptions.

I was 18 years of age on the date of the offence charged. (Mar. 25, 1929) I have no relatives residing in Salt Lake City except a sister. That the jury, as a part of their verdict, recommended leniency. That a charge of violating the liquor law was alleged to have been made against me at the time I was sentenced of which I was not guilty and no complaint was ever filed or opportunity given me to disprove, which charge, I believe, induced the court to impose the maximum penalty for the one of which I was convicted.
