Application of Jack Wilden No. 5283

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a ~~Pardon~~ Termination and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of forgery

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 9th day of Nov. A. D. 1929, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake County and State of Utah, in Third District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Oscar W. McConkie presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to a term of from 1 to 20 years with a recommendation to serve 6 months, and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable C. A. Rawlins prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Jack O. Wilden I was convicted under the name of Jack Wilden

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except as shown on records.
