Application of John G. Latham.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of sentence  
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Penitentiary  
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of attempted robbery.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the eleventh day of May  
A. D. 1929, at Salt Lake City, County of Salt Lake C  
and State of Utah, in the Third Judicial District Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable David W. Moffatt presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to the indeterminate sentence prescribed by  
law  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Penitentiary.

Fourth-Honorable Calvin Rawlins Ray Van Cott prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is John G. Latham.

I was convicted under the name of John W. Latham.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are  
as follows: Neil Edward Myers

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except None.

Eighth-I was arrested and have been in confinement since the  
23rd day of March, 1929.

Ninth- If this application is granted I will seek steady  
employment in or outside of the State of Utah as determined by  
this board.
