The following is a true and correct copy of the
minutes of the proceedings of the State Board of
Pardons, held at St. Louis, Missouri, on the
2nd day of January, 1930, in the case of
Wm. S. Mader, Defendant, vs. The State of
Missouri, Plaintiff.

The Board of Pardons, composed of the
Governor, the Attorney General, the
Judge of the Supreme Court, and the
Judges of the Circuit Courts of the State,
met in regular session on the 2nd day of
January, 1930, at St. Louis, Missouri,
for the purpose of considering the
application for pardon of Wm. S. Mader,
Defendant, in the case of Wm. S. Mader,
Defendant, vs. The State of Missouri,
Plaintiff.

The application was presented by the
Attorney General, who read the following
statement in support of the application:
"Wm. S. Mader, Defendant, was
convicted of the crime of larceny of
property to the value of \$100.00, and
was sentenced to the State Penitentiary
for a term of one year. He has since
been paroled, and has remained
free of all legal trouble since his
release from the penitentiary."
