I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination
and respectfully represent as follows: Desire to leave the state.

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of robbery

Second--I was convicted and sentenced on the 8th day of January
A. D. 1923, at Ogden, County of Weber
and State of Utah, in the Second Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable George S. Barker presiding.

Third--I was sentenced to an indeterminate term,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.
