Application of L. W. Graves No. 4979

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second Degree Burglary

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 25th day of February
A. D. 1928, at Logan County of Cache
and State of Utah, in First District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Harris presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to One to Twenty years
in the Utah State Prison
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable Dist. Attorney Young prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Laurel Wilbur Graves
I was convicted under the name of L. W. Graves

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: None

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except the above

If granted I have my transportation
and am positioned as Transitman for
the Harrison Engineering Corp. at Denver.
