First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in State Prison  
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second Degree Burglary

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the Sixth day of June  
A. D. 1927, at Salt Lake City Utah County of Salt Lake  
and State of Utah, in Third Judicial Dis. Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable L. B. Wright presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an indeterminate term,  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-- Honorable E. A. Rogers prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Melvin Macdill.  
I was convicted under the name of Nick Walker.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are  
as follows: Harry Miller.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except none.
