Application of J. R. Maxfield No. 4981

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment ~~on~~ on Parole from State Prison, under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 28th day of February, A. D. 1928, at Salt Lake City, County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in the Third Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable L. B. Wight presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term, and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable E. A. Duncan prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is John R. Maxfield I was convicted under the name of J. R. Maxfield

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Jos. Marshall.

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except the above.
