First--That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Fictitious Check

Second--I was convicted and sentenced on the 19 day of June
A. D. 1927, at Salt Lake City, County of S. L.
and State of Utah, in 3. Dist. Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Wight, presiding.

Third--I was sentenced to Indeterminate Term
in Utah State Prison,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth--Honorable S. G. Clauson, prosecuted the case.

Fifth--My true name in full is John. Castles
I was convicted under the name of Tom. Pollock
