Application of Burt Daily No. 4713

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination, to go to Colorado, and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second Degree Burglary

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 18th day of May A. D. 1926, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in Third District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Chris. Mathison presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term of from one to twenty years and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable A. E. Rogers prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Ralph Conger

I was convicted under the name of Burt Daily

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except One previous conviction in Oregon, for which I served thirteen months.

Remarks:

I can obtain work in the mines in Denver, or in Silver Plume, Colo, where work will be given me by Mr. Edward Chamberlain, Supt.
