Application of Joseph M. Roy, LeDoux #457

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Forgery

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the Seventh day of June A. D. 1927, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in Superior Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Wright presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to 30 days to Twenty Years

and thereafter was imprisoned in the County Jail until June 9th after which I was transferred to Sugar House

Fourth-- Honorable District Attorney Duncan prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Joseph Merrill Roy LeDoux. I was convicted under the name of Joseph M. Roy LeDoux.
