Application of Virgil Seward.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in The Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Robbery.

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 27th day of January
A. D. 1926, at Big Lake City County of Bohemia
and State of Utah, in the 1st Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Melvin Straight Harris presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to five to life

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Leroy B. Young prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Allen G. Vincent
I was convicted under the name of Allen G. Vincent.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Albert Thingate - Elmer Masson

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except Third Degree
Burglary.
