Application of George Swink, No. 5145.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Auto Theft.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 27th day of November A. D. 1932, at Boise, County of Carbon and State of Utah, in the Seventh District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge George Whistler presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to not to exceed five (5) years and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable J. M. Miller prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is George Swink. I was convicted under the name of George Swink.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except as aforesaid.
