Application of James E. Bowman.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a conditional termination to Arizona and respectfully represent as follows:

First -- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the state penitentiary under conviction and a sentence on a charge of robbery.

Second -- I was convicted and sentenced on the 11th day of May A. D. 1927, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in the Third District Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge L. B. Wight presiding.

Third -- I was sentenced to an indeterminate term and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State penitentiary.

Fourth -- Honorable E. C. Rogers prosecuted the case.

Fifth -- My true name in full is Walter Franklin Hershberger I was convicted under the name of James E. Bowman.

Sixth -- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh -- I have never been convicted of any offense except None.
