Application of Melvin Golsan

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination or Pardon
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second degree burglary.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the Sixth day of July
A. D. 1929, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in Third district Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Oscar W. McConkie presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indefinite term of
from one to twenty years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable Ray Vancott prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Melvin Golsan
