Application of William Stone

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in In Parole
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Obstruction R.R.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 19 day of August
A. D. 1929, at Logan County of Cache
and State of Utah, in District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable M. C. Harris presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to one and not to exceed ten years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State penitentiary
for about two months after which I was paroled to Owen
Nebeker

Fourth-Honorable Horsley prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is George William Stone
I was convicted under the name of William Stone Jr.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: None

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except this one
Tampering with the railroad track.
