Application of John Cox No. 5210

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second Degree Burglary

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 29th day of May
A. D. 1929, at Beaver City County of Beaver
and State of Utah, in the Fifth Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable LeRoy H. Cox presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term in the State Prison of
not less than one year and not more than twenty years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable George H. Lunt prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is John Cox

I was convicted under the name of John Cox

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Richard Cox, De Patterson, and Lester Jameson

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except for being intoxicated
several years ago.
