To the Honorable Board of Pardon of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon  
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison  
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Robbery

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 4th day of November  
A. D. 1929, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake  
and State of Utah, in 2nd District Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Oscar McConkie presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term of  
from five years to life  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable Ray Van Cott prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Elmer Clark Cole  
I was convicted under the name of Charles Clark

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are  
as follows: Orsen Meacham

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except a term in  
the Idaho Industrial Training  
school for stealing a car automobile
