Gentlemen. I understand there is a pardon being asked for Martin E. Curtis (or M.E. Curtis) sent up from Price, for forgery in August, or September last. Perhaps the facts of this case are not fully known. I wish to state that Mr. Curtis has been up to passing bad checks and forging checks all his life, he did time in Uintah County jail at Vernal, Utah for this offense a short time before he was sent up from Price. I am not in sympathy with pardoning him out. He has broken his word every time his people and friends have helped him out of such trouble.

He is also lazy, and I can get you proof that he broke in a house, and broke open a trunk and took a watch and gun. Please inform me what steps I can take to keep him from securing a pardon. I am deeply interested in this as I have a dear sister that Mr. Curtis has a great influence with. He is not worthy of such a girl.
