Application of Morton Reed

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon,
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Weber County Jail
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Attempt of Forgery.

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 23rd day of July
A. D. 1923, at Ogden. County of Weber
and State of Utah, in City Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Roberts presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to Six months in
the County Jail
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Weber County Jail.

Fourth-- Honorable Attorney Wilson prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Morton Reed
I was convicted under the name of Morton Reed.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Harry Dimmick.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except this one.
