Application of Richard Dillon

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence  
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison  
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Burglary

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November  
A. D. 1924, at Price County of Carbon  
and State of Utah, in 7<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Geo. Christensen presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to One to Twenty Years  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable W. B. Dalton prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Richard Dillon  
I was convicted under the name of Richard Dillon
