I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Commution
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Third Degree Burglary

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the twenty fourth day of March
A. D. 1923, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in Volunteer District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Johnson presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to Three Months to 3 yrs
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison
at Sugarhouse Utah

Fourth-- Honorable G. A. Pogue prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Lee Williams
I was convicted under the name of Lee Williams

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Charles Glass,

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except the present
offense in the State of Utah
