Application of GEORGE S. SHAW

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Carnal knowledge of a female under
18 years of age.

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 29th day of September,
A. D. 1921, at Ogden City, County of Weber
and State of Utah, in the Second Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable James N. Kimball presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to a term of not more than five years in the
Utah State Prison,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison the early part of
April, 1922.

Fourth-- Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is George S. Shaw

I was convicted under the name of George S. Shaw

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Maude Moore

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except the one above stated.

(I was paroled in August 1922, and have been on parole ever
since that time.)
