Your Honor, I am taking the liberty of writing you a few lines in my own behalf, which I hope you will take into consideration, and am sincerely hoping that you will grant me the privilege of a rehearing, permitting me to testify as to the merits of my case, before the members of the Honorable Board of Pardons, at their meeting this month.
