

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 5TH, 1924.

THE COURT: What is your plea?

THE COURT: How old is your mother?

DEFENDANT AGUILAR: About forty-six.

THE COURT: How many children do they have?

DEFENDANT AGUILAR: Six. One is married.

THE COURT: Are you the youngest?

DEFENDANT AGUILAR: No, sir.

THE COURT: How many younger than you?

DEFENDANT AGUILAR: Two. A boy and a girl.
