So my recommendation in this matter is that the young man be parolled, say after 30 or 60 days, and that he be permitted to go into the employment at the ranch under the contrroll of Mr. Lanning who who, I have learned is a very responsible and good man; and then if his conduct is proven to be satisfactory that he be pardoned..

I also learned that he is from a very good family-- has splendid parents and brothers and sisters, and it seems as though he does not desire them to know anything about the trouble that he is in.

I trust that this information may be of use to you in considering this case.
