BE IT REMEMBERED that on Friday, September 5, 1924, the defendant in the above-entitled case appeared before the court, Hon. Wm. M. McCrea, Judge, for arraignment on the information filed against him, the State being represented by E. Q. Rogers, Esq., District Attorney, and the defendant being represented by A. A. Duncan, Esq., and the following proceedings were had:

MR. ROGERS: In this case, your honor, which is entitled, State of Utah vs. Clifton Cook, Leo Grobstein and Tony Douglas, Clifton Cook was not bound over, but the defendants Douglas and Grobstein were, and Mr. Duncan represents the defendant Douglas. Douglas, I think, has heretofore entered a plea of not guilty and I understand at this time, from Mr. Duncan, that he desires to withdraw that plea and enter a plea of guilty.

THE COURT: Well, now, just a second. The information here isn't marked filed; there is nothing to indicate that it has been filed or that a plea was entered.

MR. ROGERS: I am certain that he and Grobstein were arraigned.

MR. DUNCAN: I don't know about that.

MR. ROGERS: Well, now, it may be that he wasn't arraigned.

MR. DUNCAN: He says he hasn't.
